Ten years ago I served on the board of directors for a preschool that was sponsored by four different congregations. One day I walked into the monthly board meeting about five minutes late and was greeting with cheers of joy and the chairperson saying, “Now we have enough people to make a quorum and vote on some business items!” My response was, “Well, it’s good to know that today I have made a difference.”

It’s always a good feeling to know that your presence, your participation, your involvement in something, your work and efforts and life make a difference...a difference in the world or in the lives of others. Now the truth, of course, is that each person at that meeting had an equal contribution to complete the number needed for the quorum, and my being there was no more important than anyone else’s presence.

Our church is made up of many individual members that each have an important role. There is a story about a church with four members named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was sure that Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody’s job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it, but Nobody realized that Everybody wouldn’t do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what

Anybody could have.

If each of us sits back and thinks that someone else will do the work needed or will take care of problems that come up, then the work may never get done and the problems may never be addressed. Our individual efforts do make a difference and our work together increases our impact on the world. Paul explains in many of his letters that while together we make up the body of Christ, it is our individual gifts and talents that allow us to function better as a team.

Please, do not underestimate the importance of your individual contributions to the ministries of this congregation. When you are not here, you are missed. You just might be the one the rest of us are needing to complete the team!

Conflict Resolution Tip

Pastor-Parish Committee will be including articles a few times each year concerning conflict resolution or open communication. This month's emphasis comes from the article "Ten Strategies for Handling Aggressive or Problem Personalities" by Preston Ni. One of the strategies he shares is 'separate the person from the issue'. He writes, "Establish yourself as a strong problem solver with excellent people skills. Win more rapport, cooperation and respect. In every communication situation, there are two elements present: The relationship you have with this person, and the issue you are discussing. An effective communicator knows how to separate the person from the issue, and be soft on the person and firm on the issue. For example: 'I appreciate you putting a lot of time into this project. At the same time, I see that three of the ten requirements are still incomplete. Let's talk about how to finish the job on schedule.' Or 'I really want you to come with us. Unfortunately, if you're going to be late like the last few times, we'll have to leave without you.' When we're soft on the person, people are more open to what we have to say. When we're firm on the issue, we show ourselves as strong problem solvers.

Lord, I'm Ready Now...



A little over a year ago I had reached a plateau in my life—a turning point really. I decided I was very content with who I was, where I was, and what I had. For years I had prayed and hoped for someone in my life, but after a long fishing trip with a bunch of casts that reeled in empty hooks, or fish that needed thrown back, I decided to be happy with being alone. Friends would tell me that old saying, “when you quit looking it will happen”, and I would smile doubtfully, realizing that I honestly didn’t care if it happened or not. So, as soon as I had planted my feet into the land of perpetual singleness...along came Brad.

He was handsome, seemed sure of himself, and was persistent in asking me out. I said no, or nothing at all. Then one day I gave in...I said yes. We had a very unconventional first date— he sat across from me at my dance studio while I glued rhinestones on costumes. For hours we talked, laughed, joked, and even cried a little.
