The Waitress...

“Oh No!”, I screamed in my head, as I eyed the waitress making her way to our table. Not this one again! Going to a local restaurant with my husband on “date night” is something I always look forward to. What I do NOT look forward to is getting waited on by this one particular waitress. She is always crabby, a little stand-offish, and never smiles. She is direct and to the point— here’s your drink, what do you want to order, there it is. I was at a point where I considered not going to the restaurant because chances were...I would get HER! Waiting for her to finish her walk to us, I hid my frustration and decided to see if I could crack the “Ice Queen”. I made up some little joke about wanting dessert, but this body would not agree with me on my decision. She said that she wished she had that problem— her body would not allow her to gain weight. Of course I inquired, quite intrigued, why. She explained that no matter how much she ate that she could not keep weight on. I almost joked that I wished I had that problem, but I could tell that this was something that bothered her as much as , well...it bothered her as much not being able to GAIN weight as it did me trying to NOT gain weight! Then she shocked me. Pulling out a chair, across the table from Brad and I, she made herself comfortable. She said that since her son had committed suicide, and her husband had died, she couldn’t pull it together. It had been four months since she had lost them, and although she was trying to make her world better, there really wasn’t much left in her life. She said working was the only thing that kept her mind off of all the heartache, and even then

she couldn’t shake the feeling of being alone. When she spoke she held my gaze. I couldn’t take my eyes from hers. This woman, this woman who made me shudder when I walked in with fear that she would wait on me and ruin my perfect evening...was hurt. She had so much built up anger, stress, bitterness, that there was no way to hide it. Our conversation lasted over an hour, with her leaving once in a while to go check on her other tables. Each time she came back to our table, we picked the conversation right back up. I searched for magic words to make her feel better, but they wouldn’t come. We shared, we understood, we cried. I left feeling pretty unhappy with myself that evening- I had judged another human being without knowing her truth. Her and I hugged as I left , and now when I go into the restaurant I HOPE she is there to wait on us. Sometimes I see smiles. Sometimes I hear her laugh a little. Always...I see pain, with ever the slightest glimpse of hope. As for me? I was finally able to forgive myself for judging her before I knew her story. But I promise you...I won’t let it happen again. In this busy world we live in, take the time to know someone, to talk to someone, before you pass judgment on “who they are”. We all have battles we are dealing with. Sometimes, somebody may need a little help holding up their shield. And sometimes, they may just need someone to listen...and to care. Loving others and caring for them is the greatest gift in the world. And...it’s free! The best part about giving out that gift...you get a bigger gift back!
