He greeted me after an Easter service one year with the question, "Doesn't it get old for you? I mean, telling this same Easter story over and over every year?" I'm sure he probably thought the same thing about that birth of the baby story that we tell over and over every year in December too.

I pulled him aside and asked him how many spring seasons he had lived through and he replied that he had seen about sixty-five springs. I asked him if he ever got tired of saying goodbye to winter and welcoming spring. He told me that no, he never got tired of welcoming spring because it meant that it was time to plant crops again after spending the winter getting his equipment ready. I explained that just as the spring season always gets him excited about planting crops and the potential they have for new life in his fields and an increase in his bank account, the resurrection of Christ should excite all Christians as we realize that Christ's victory over death is a promise of new life for us, as well as the increase in more abundant life for us here on earth and a purpose to live a life following the teachings of Christ.

Between that Easter and Christmas Sunday later that same year, this man attended worship about twice a month on average. The Sunday following Christmas he waited until everyone else had left the sanctuary before he approached me. He said that until that talk we

had months ago on Easter, he had never seen much relevance between his life and church services, sermons, and the Bible. Now, he discovered that when he showed up for worship with an attitude of expecting to get something out of it, he always did. He said he no longer showed up at church waiting for something to jump out and catch his attention. Instead. he took what was offered in the Scripture reading, the sermon, the words of the songs, and other parts of the service and found a path for those words to have meaning in his life.

When we read the Bible for the hundredth time, we can always discover new things in it and God speaking new messages to us. It's the same thing every Sunday as we gather for worship. We can allow ourselves to be distracted by a fussy child, a change in the worship format, the sound of a train passing by, or just waiting for something that sounds relevant to our lives...OR... we can thank God for the child being in the church, open ourselves to new ways of being God's people, pray for all who are traveling, bring our own lives into the words of the Bible, the sermon, or the song. Worship is not meant to be a passive activity like a concert, where we just sit back and enjoy. Worship is a give and take, a dance with God in the ways we offer ourselves to God and receive from God. That is what makes it relevant to our lives.

This year's ski trip has transformed from a congregation, to we siblings adjusting our travel times so that one of us will always be there throughout the two-week stay.

As always, I look forward to this time to get away and enjoy time spent with family. Yet I also feel grief and trepidation, predicting the addition of responsibility and caretaker onto simple companionship and comradery. The constant reminder to cherish the laughter and love through the signs and symptoms, to surrender to one more run down the dreaded double black. Anticipating that this may well be the last of a tradition, and the beginning of saying good -bye.
