## “Book News”

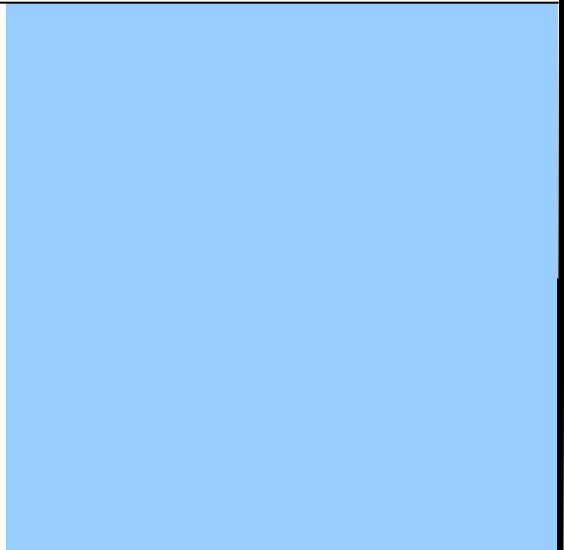

## "I Love You Thiiiiisssss Much!"

I see it all the time, little kids stretching their arms out as far as they can, and declaring loudly in the sweetest voices you will ever hear, that they love their Mommy or Daddy that much. It always touches my heart, and yes, brings a little tear to my eye. Why? Because it is so simple, so honest, and so easily given. What happens in our lives to make us quit declaring our love to each other? Or making it hard to express how we feel about someone? And do we ever consider the consequences that come with "pulling back love"?

I am blessed to be around children of all ages every day of the week. I see the interactions with their parents, grandparents, and even siblings. I pay attention to those who get hugs and kisses goodbyes, and those who are dropped at the door with not so much as a "Goodbye". As you can guess, the children who are doted on are more productive and self-assured than those who seem to get less attention. Maybe the world is easier for them. Maybe they know that no matter what, at the end of the day they will be loved. 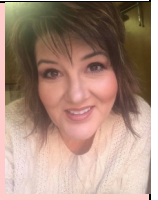
