The "Reaching Out" monthly update will let readers know what is happening currently so that any help that is needed is communicated to everyone. It will include the 'how-to' for each project and report on the results of outreach projects.

So let's get this inaugural update started!

January provides a breather from the busy November and December activities.

FCC will provide a meal for the MVC Christian student group on Sunday, January 28. If you would like to be part of a team that provides a supper for about 25 college kids, please let Ginger or the office know.



- The Mitten Tree is in the parlor and will be 'decorated' with donated mittens, hats, socks, gloves, and more. All the items will be donated to area schools in January. (Tip: As items go on sale, think ahead to next year's Mitten Tree!)
- And every month, you have the opportunity to bring non-perishable food items to add to the large box inside the East entrance. These items will be given to the Community Food Pantry which informs us that giving really slows down after the holidays, but the need remains.

Recap of November and December activities: The biggest outreach event of the year, the Chili/Soup Supper & Eats, Sweets, and Treats Sale, was Friday, December 1<sup>st</sup>. At the time of this writing, we don't have results to share, but the participation before the event was phenomenal!

- A crew of 15 members made almost 300 soups and meals for the Eats, Sweets, and Treats Salein less than three hours under the incredible direction of Tiffany Thornton. Thank you to everyone who donated groceries and time to make this happen.
- Outreach committee members created six scenes for Holiday Backdrops. They are amazing! Thank you for the creative work and for all of you who helped spread the word with your fun pictures. Hopefully, these upbeat scenes helped draw people into the church and provided a little extra joy.
- Thank you to the many who helped set up the chili supper, cook, serve, and clean up. It's heartwarming to see the way our congregation works together to make this fundraiser happen!

Other ways FCC reached out in November and December included:

- CWF assembled 108 Personal Hygiene Kits that will be shared with area schools for students who lack these basic supplies.
- Members filled 16 shoeboxes with toys and gifts for Operation Christmas Child. These presents are headed to kids in desperate situations around the world.
- Several hundred boxes of Jell-O were collected for the Holiday Project that provides food and gift assistance to area families. We will continue collecting through December 12.

Thank you to everyone who helped in any way. Ginger calls this time of year "the season of asks". It seems that so many of our outreach efforts occur in November and December, and it can be overwhelming. In 2024, we hope to spread the non-perishable asks out over the year. Watch the newsletter and bulletins for info.

Perhaps instead of "the season of asks", we should think of this time as "the season of opportunities for helping"; for 'Reaching Out' to our community.
