# "Welcome to Easter"

Since Ash Wednesday on February 18, we have been living through the season of Lent, the weeks that lead us to Easter Sunday. The final week of the Lenten season will be filled with many opportunities for us individually and as a church family to make the most of our time to prepare for the cross and the empty tomb. Easter Sunday, the day when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, sing the songs of victory over death, and hear the story of the empty tomb, will be here on April 5. It is the day when some of us will gather to watch the sun slowly come up in the east during a sunrise service. It is a day filled with traditions for families and for the church. Girls wear beautiful spring dresses, boys are convinced to clean up and even dress up a bit, and ladies can be seen sporting new hats. Join us for a meaningful Maundy Thursday worship service in the sanctuary on April 2 at


