
"Buds and Blossoms "

In October I attended a Persons in Ministry Retreat hosted by the Region. Almost one hundred ministers and church leaders gathered in Columbia for three days. Two of the topics of informal discussions were the facts that attendance was dropping in all congregations and there was a dire need to do something different.

One metaphor in particular stood out to me. A flower remains closed in the bud until the effort required to keep it closed becomes greater than the effort needed to allow it to open and bloom. In so many congregations today, the work and pain to keep our churches the same and closed to change has become greater than what it takes to open them up to new ideas. When we are hurting enough by staying closed, and can overcome our fear of change...we allow ourselves the opportunity to bloom into something new and exciting.

My sabbatical study of 25 congregations that have opened their church space to non-profits and other community organizations found that 95% of them were willing to do so only when they reached a point of desperation, when they were hurting bad enough in attendance and/or in finances that they had to try something new. These churches found new life and in some cases, a new calling. A few years ago

even developed a new division to help churches make changes – Hope Partnership for Missional Transformation.

It's important to realize that the changes we are considering go beyond combining worship services. They include changes to make our worship service more inviting and welcoming to visitors - changes such as relaxing the service, including more contemporary music, doing away with those things that make guests feel uncomfortable, simplifying some things, etc. They include making the church itself more welcoming and inviting by changing furniture or adding designated space for young children. They include focusing less on our past history and more on the present and what we can do to be Christ's church today. More than anything...they include changes in each of us to make us more open to people who dress differently than we do on Sunday mornings or people who like worship songs that are strange to us or people who don't know the Lord's Prayer or the Gloria Patri or when to stand or sit. etc.

Yes, these changes will be uncomfortable, maybe even painful in some sense...but they sure beat dying on the vine. This is a time for us to open our hearts and minds to bloom and see what new thing God has in store for us.
