"Are You Training?"

Mid to late February is a time to celebrate. Some people go all out to celebrate Chinese New Year and others make a big deal out of Valentine's Day. Still more will celebrate President's Day or Black History Month. But I'm thinking about something else – spring training for baseball! Major league players, along with a few minor leaguers who are invited, have reported to their training grounds in Arizona (the Cactus League) and Florida (the Grapefruit League) to begin training for the season which will begin March 29.

They have just a few weeks to hone their skills that have been dormant since they last played in September or October. They will use this time to retrain muscles to react to game situations, eyes to focus in on the pitched ball, and hands to grip the ball and bat in just the right way. They will learn again how to work together with their teammates, including new ones, and how to cooperate with each other to form a team. Spring training is an important part of their preparation for the 162 regular-season games that waits for them over the hot summer days, and hopefully some cold weather postseason games as well.

If we as Christians, working together as a team within the church, have a spring training period, it would have to be Lent.

It always begins in February or March and lasts until Easter in late March or April. Lent is a time for us to practice spiritual disci-



plines that focus our attention on God and lead us to be more faithful followers of God. It's a period of training that leads us into Palm Sunday, Holy Week with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Lent prepares us for all the opportunities to serve throughout the year, including our S.O.S. Sunday on April 22.

Of course, there is no set annual time for us as Christians or as a congregation to train or to really get down to the business of being faithful to God once again. Both our training and our faithfulness are ongoing aspects of the Christian life. Still, the liturgical calendar of the church does have its ebbs and flows and as much as Advent is a season of waiting and preparing. Lent is a season of repenting and training. There is still time, four weeks, for you to make the most of this season by adding a spiritual discipline or habit to your daily routine.
