#### **Conflict Resolution Tip**

Pastor-Parish Committee will be including articles a few times each year concerning conflict resolution or open communication. This month's emphasis comes from the article"Ten Strategies for Handling Aggressive or Problem Personalities" by Preston Ni. One of the strategies he shares is 'separate the person from the issue'. He writes, "Establish yourself as a strong problem solver with excellent people skills. Win more rapport, cooperation and respect. In every communication situation, there are two elements present: The relationship you have with this person, and the issue you are discussing. An effective communicator knows how to separate the person from the issue, and be soft on the person and firm on the issue. For example: 'I appreciate you putting a lot of time into this project. At the same time, I see that three of the ten requirements are still incom-

plete. Let's talk about how to finish the job on schedule.' Or 'I really want you to come with us. Unfortunately, if you're going to be late like the last few times, we'll have to leave without you.' When we're soft on the person, people are more open to what we have to say. When we're firm on the issue, we show ourselves as strong problem solvers.

## **Drive Up Worship Services**

Our summer Drive-Up Worship Service will begin in the parking lot at 8:00 a.m. on May 24 (Memorial Day weekend) and last through September 6 (Labor Day weekend). Attendance at this service last year averaged 51 and included the regular attendance of many non-church members.
