"Faces of Jesus"

On December 17 members of the Marshall Ministerial Alliance were treated by Missouri Valley College President, Dr. Thompson, and the college chaplain, Rev. Pam Sebastian, with a tour of the college's new art exhibit, 'The Faces of Jesus'. The more than 260 portraits were a personal collection of Rev. Paul Smith of Kansas City. When he retired, he offered them up to colleges and universities with affiliations to churches. It came down to two final choices – Duke University in Durham, North Carolina and Missouri Valley College in Marshall, Missouri. Missouri Valley received the gift last year and it is now displayed in the Ecklison-Mabee Theatre, across the hall from the theatre.

The display, featuring depictions of Christ, includes a great variety of artists, concepts, and perspectives, including a moving one of Christ's view from the cross. They are grouped by theme such as: Madonna and Child, Jesus as Shepherd, Jesus as healer, the suffering servant, the crucifixion, the transfiguration, laughing Jesus, etc. A few sets of guide books are kept in the gallery giving information on each portrait. The collection has been appraised to be worth more than \$300,000.

I highly recommend that everyone take advantage of this great opportunity to view this collection, but I also warn that some depictions may not be suitable for children or for the parents of teenagers who are not willing to answer questions about the material presented. Artists have a tendency to perceive things through innovative, creative, and sometimes disturbing eyes. The gallery plans to be
