#### Looking Back at Our History

Homecoming Sunday on September 24 will celebrate the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our congregation. Priscilla McReynolds of the Library Committee offers us this look back:

Three years after the founding of Marshall in 1839, Thomas M. Allen of Columbia stated that he had held a meeting a Marshall and organized a church with 27 members. Some think that they exact date may have been September 27, 1842. They first met in the county courthouse. A frame building was erected at the cost of \$2,000 in 1851, and the church became a permanent religious force in the community up until the Civil War. Until the war, the church was prosperous with several preachers and pastors.

During the war years, 1861-1865, Marshall was in the midst of the devastation of war, and all the church records were destroyed. While the preachers went elsewhere to preach, some would return for a 'long, drawn out meeting' on occasion and other would stop over a Sunday or a weekday to greet and strengthen their fellows members. The pulpit was covered by almost all the pioneer preachers of those days.

The little frame church was occupied by Federal troops, and eventually as a stable for their horses, so that from being 'a house of prayer' it became a place of war. When the troops were moving into the church building, the black janitor ran out with the communion set and saved it by hiding it in a gunny sack.

When the troops finally moved out in 1865, all the window panes were gone, the shutters were off their hinges, and no paint was on the exterior. The outside looked like a stable. In 1867 a new church building was built. It was occupied until 1886. The first regular pastor after the was W.H. Robinson, a brilliant speaker who served the congregation faithfully, both before and after he was stricken blind.

"I don't believe in God, but you never know." -17 yr. old (who attends youth group regularly

"Wait a minute....this is another one of your trick questions that has no right or wrong answer; it's whatever our 'truth' is. We're onto you, Kris!" -11 yr. old

"Can we please package up our leftovers and take them to the First Responders?" -16 yr. old after the youth luncheon

"I love me just the way I am. And I love others just the way they are. No one should have to change for anyone." -13 yr old

"You don't have to be big to do something bigger. I mean, you don't have to be a giant to take down a giant." - 9 yr. old

"I'm getting baptized this Sunday; I can't wait!!" -9 yr. old

(on comparing ones' faith to a swimming pool) "Sometimes I'm doing laps in the deep end, sometimes I'm drowning, sometimes I'm the lifeguard, sometimes I'm dipping my toes in the water, and yet sometimes I'm outside the gate, scared to even go in. But I guess that's what faith, and grace, is all about." -15 yr. old
