**“Questions from Church Camp”** Wonder about what else they may still discover about God; and learn that discovery about God is a journey with no end.

By the time you receive this newsletter I will be at Covenant Point Camp and Retreat Center near Holts-Summit directing our region's Elementary Camp for campers who have just finished 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> grades. This will be my 80<sup>th</sup> church camp to be part of as an adult leader, but for many of the campers, it will be their first. All camps within the Mid-American Region this year will be using a curriculum developed by Rev. Lee Yates and other Disciple youth leaders across the nation. I first met Lee 12 years ago when he was the Youth Minister at Maryville, Missouri and he and I both served as adult sponsors on the Disciples' General Youth Counsel.

I've been planning our camp based on the theme, so I've spent a lot of time with it. I know that other regions are using this same curriculum. It's a great theme for the days at church camp for any age group. It is presented in question form with Scripture and theological studies for each day. As I share the daily themes with you, I ask that you ask these questions of yourselves and determine how you might answer them.

Day 1: What if we belong to God? Psalm 139. God created us to that God can love us and know us intimately. Campers will: learn that God already knows and loves them; be assured that God knows their hopes and fears; get to know each other as children of God; and experience welcome and hospitality.

Day 2: What if God is bigger than what we imagine? Luke 1:35-55. God chooses each of us to make God's love bigger and we celebrate the ways God's love can be made bigger. Campers will: explore the vastness of God's creation; discover amazing visions of God's people that have already come to pass;

Day 3: What if hope is real? Mark 2:1-5. Jesus affirms that trusting in and acting on hopeful instincts is a powerful way to embody faith. Campers will: learn that hope is needed in our lives; learn that hope can always be found and is a sign of God's presence; learn where our hopes align with God's hope and seek to align them further.

Day 4: What if there is more than enough? John 6:1-14. Jesus shows us that we already have more than enough. Campers will: learn that God provides us tools to be who we need to be; experience that the more we trust God in our lives, the more we find peace and abundance; find that combining their gifts with God and others is needed to accomplish our hopes; and learn that God will find a place where we can contribute.

Day 5: What if we speak up? Mark 7:24-30. If even Jesus can have his mind opened by fearlessness in the face of injustice, just imagine how big God's grace must be. Campers will: find the courage to use their gifts as God's voice in the world; reflect on where the world needs them most; and connect with God's vision for the world.

Day 6: What if we change the world? Matthew 5:13-16. Jesus encourages us to embrace the ways that God wants to use us to make the world a better place. Campers will: learn that responding to God's call can make a difference; imagine the world as God intends; believe in God's power to work through them, learn that God's Spirit is alive in us; and find the community's support in changing the world.

## Youth News

“...and a little child shall lead them.” Isaiah 11:6

On May 20<sup>th</sup> at 3:30am, 11 youth along with Rachel and I crammed our luggage and selves into a van for a week of mission and service. Although this was my fifth mission trip, this was my first where most of our youth were young, middle school aged children. Admittedly, I was apprehensive, expecting immaturity, silliness, long sleepless nights, homesickness, and lots of hormones. I mean c'mon, 12-14 year olds in the throes of pubescence is not my idea of a good time!

After 13+ hours on the road, we landed in Alamosa, a small town in the middle of the San Luis Valley in Colorado. We had a brief introduction to our week ahead by our volunteer coordinator, then settled in for a restless night full of anticipation and apprehension.

The next five days would be a reality check. For 10 of the 11 youth, this was their first mission trip, first time away from family, and first time experiencing poverty, home-

lessness, mental illness, desperation and victims of abuse; a daunting encounter for even the seasoned workers among us.

Yet once again, my predictions failed me. Any fear or trepidation in our team was concealed behind an outpouring of compassion, love, mercy and hard work. These young servants:

- Shared meals with, met and developed relationships and friendships with dozens of guests at the soup kitchen
- Hid their horror and sympathy behind joy and lightheartedness to spend afternoons with young children who have suffered physical, mental and/or sexual abuse, neglect and trauma.
- Dug out a driveway and foundation for one of hundreds of citizens living in the flats with no water, electricity or shelter.
- Weeded and planted in a community garden
- Cleared a fire prone area of dead trees, then split it into firewood.
- Prepped, cooked, served and ate meals at the soup kitchen.

- Spent time in devotion, prayer, poverty simulation, education, and learning.

Although we adults were prepared to encourage and teach proper work ethic, keep the youth busy and focused, resolve conflicts, wipe tears and ensure they didn't kill themselves or each other, we quickly adjusted our preconceived notions and learned, worked and served alongside our team. Instead of leading this remarkable group, we were led by them. We were led to love others, simply because they are human. We were led to feel compassion and empathy, without the desire to 'fix'. And we were led to embrace each other's beautiful, unique differences and recognize each other as cherished and beloved children of God. We weren't led because we led them first....no. We were led because at the very heart of Jesus we learned that “...a little child shall lead them.”
