To ensure cast members will be able to make the practices, we have set the following dates.



#### **ONE for ALL**

(Details are being worked out, but what follows is the general plan.) Heating and air conditioning are big expenses for families and for our church building. These dollars will be split between FCC and HEAT which is a program that helps people in need pay their utility bills. chairs, organize the kitchen and drive-thru areas, and enjoy pizza after. Strong, young backs are especially appreciated!

#### Chili Supper &E,S,T Sale:

Saturday, December 6 will kick off with making chili in the morning under the direction of Virginia Bryant. Sherry Shannon & Linda Crews captain a team to make the veggie soup. That evening, FCC members serve the chili & soup, prepare the hot dogs, plate the donated homemade desserts, sell the frozen meals and bake sale items, and man the drive-thru. 
